

Keep on Shining

Charles W. Naylor (1874-1950) was a traveling evangelist until misfortune struck. First a tentpole fell on him as he prepared for a meeting. A year later, a bus accident left him partially paralyzed.

Despite experiencing chronic pain, Naylor became a prolific author and hymnist, dictating almost 150 songs. He often wrote about God's loving care amid adversity. One of his hymns begins:

When the winds of persecution blow, When the streams of hatred tow'rd you flow, When your foes in number seem to grow, Just keep on shining.

"God's comfort in our times of sorrow is not an imaginary thing," Naylor wrote. "It can be so real that it is a balm for our wounded spirits. Having passed through the experience more than once, [I know] how real and vital and sustaining the comfort of God can be."

THINK WASHCLOTHS

Mid-Ky Presbytery has taken on the task of filling 1,000 Personal Hygiene Kits to be used by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for those in need. SFPC's role in this project is to supply 300 washcloths for the kits.

There will be a box in Fellowship Hall where you can place your washcloths. (Big Lots has a nice 9 pack for \$4.99.)

The Counterpoints class will soon start a new book The Politics of Faith by Dr. Jerry Sumney, professor of biblical studies at Lexington Theological Seminary and a frequent guest speaker at our annual Adult Bible Study. Sumney is not a literalist, but is a strong believer that good biblical insights help us in dealing with most questions, including political cultural and public policy. Sumney leans to the liberal side, but does not go over the edge. He clearly believes that the Bible has much to say about what governments should be concerned about.

The book recognizes that the Bible can be cited in support of conflicting positions. The Bible is sometimes used in support of limited government while at other times it is cited in support of expanding government and increasing taxes. Sumney believes that sometimes culture dictates public policy rather than a legitimate understanding of biblical witness.

Sumney does a good job of working his way through the Bible in attempting to Discern the Will of God, The Role of the Church and The Proper Methods for Making Personal Choices. Sumney seems to suggest that laws should be preferential to the poor, but recognizes that the wealthy have legitimate rights, as well.

The Counterpoints class does what its name suggests, it seeks to entertain all points of view. The class generates lively discussion and are encouraged to speak and actively participate. Come and join a fun and informative class where THINKING IS A MUST!
