Report of the August SFPC Stated Session Meeting.

SFPC's Session held its stated meeting on Sunday, August 18, 2024. Rev. Terry Lester served as Moderator, and Elders Beth Avent, Lindsey Kimbleton, Bill Kirkland, Rob Moore, Joseph Schmidt, George Seay, Jennifer Grisham, and Mary Elizabeth Stivers attended the meeting. Jennifer Grisham opened the meeting with prayer, and the following actions were taken at the meeting.

Due to Carolyn Harilson's passing on August 1, 2024, the Session thanked the Lord for her life, and she was removed from SFPC's active roll. Carolyn was born on May 31, 1932, and became a member of SFPC on October 19, 2014. She had retired from a career as an executive/legal secretary. Carolyn was also a gifted writer, authoring 7 fiction and non-fiction books. Please remember her son, Gregory Chisolm, in your prayers.

SFPC's financial reports were reviewed, and these reports reflect that SFPC is operating in fiscal compliance with the approved Budget. At the recommendation of the Outreach Committee chaired by Beth Avent and Alice De Lambre, a motion unanimously passed authorizing Outreach to distribute (from the committee's budget) \$250 to PRIDE, \$1,000 to Focus on Race Relations (FORR) and \$500 to support the upcoming 9/22/24 "Coming Home to South Frankfort Presbyterian Church Service." At a second recommendation of Outreach, a motion was unanimously passed authorizing \$8,500 from the 2023 Endowment Fund distribution to be used to allocate \$2,500 to Hope For Tomorrow, \$2,500 to Simon House, \$2,500 to Fresh Start (formerly the Womens' Shelter) and \$1,000 to Yes Arts. Because this \$8,500 comes from the Endowment Fund distribution, a second vote is required on this item. Beth Avent reported that SFPC's distribution of \$6,600 from the Outreach budget to ROSM had been made, and that ROSM certainly appreciated the donation.

Rev. Terry Lester's service as SFPC's Interim Pastor will end the last Sunday in October. He has done an absolutely fantastic job ministering to our congregation, but he and Jan are now ready to fully enjoy retirement. Accordingly, Carol Banks, Chair of the Worship Committee, has arranged for pastors to lead us in worship each Sunday through the end of December. Mary Elizabeth Stivers, chair of the Fellowship Committee, reported that the committee is planning a luncheon in Rev. Lester's honor on October 27, 2024. Fellowship is also planning a lunch to be provided immediately after the 9/22/24 "Coming Home to South Frankfort Presbyterian Church Service." Finally, Fellowship's motion that \$550 from the 2023 Endowment Fund distribution be used to purchase books and pay for snacks and drinks for an Adult/Child Book Club was approved the required second time.

Thank you for taking the time to read this brief report, which shows that through its members, SFPC continues to strive to be a living testimony to God's love, grace and mercy.

Living Out Grace

Talk is cheap, especially when it comes to biblical concepts such as grace. How can people grasp the meaning of unmerited favor unless they experience it firsthand?

That happened to Mephibosheth, son of Jonathan and grandson of Saul, in 2 Samuel 9. After his father was killed in battle, the disabled Mephibosheth hid in fear. Why? In Old Testament times, a new king killed the previous ruler's bloodline. But David, keeping a promise he'd made to his friend Jonathan, showed Mephibosheth "the kindness of God" (v. 3). Imagine the impact that had on Mephibosheth's life.

By contrast, failing to live into God's grace and failing to give it out to others leads to many struggles, according to pastor David Seamands. "We read, we hear, we believe a good theology of grace," he wrote, but "that's not the way we live. The good news of the Gospel of grace has not penetrated the level of our emotions." Instead, may we make a point each day to treat others with God's kindness and mercy.
