

Report of the September SFPC Stated Session Meeting

The SFPC Session's September stated meeting was held on Sunday, September 15, 2024. Rev. Terry Lester served as Moderator, and Elders Beth Avent, Lindsey Kimbleton, Bill Kirkland, Rob Moore, Carol Banks, Alice De Lambre, George Seay, and Jennifer Grisham were present. George Seay opened the meeting with prayer, a quorum was present, and the following actions were taken at the meeting.

Ann Maenza, the Chair of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC),

provided a written report on the PNC's efforts to identify a new permanent pastor

for SFPC. The report indicated that the PNC continues to work diligently, but is having difficulty finding a qualified candidate that "matches" with SFPC's needs. The PNC recently updated the Ministry Discernment Profile (job description) for SFPC, and that may help to locate a qualified candidate.

The financial reports provided to the Session by the Budget and Stewardship Committee reflect that SFPC is operating in fiscal compliance with the approved budget. The Outreach Committee and the Fellowship Committee are working on the Coming Home to SFPC Worship Service scheduled for September 22, 2024, to ensure it is a success.

The Outreach Committee reported that the Food Pantry is holding a food drive and SFPC members will be requested to bring canned goods and other items to SFPC up through October 20, 2024, when the donated items will be delivered to the Food Pantry. Additionally, World Communion Sunday is October 6, 2024. The Kings Center held a Fashion

Extravaganza fundraiser on September 14, 2024, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the Memories venue on 811 Louisville Road. The second required motion was made and unanimously passed approving the Outreach Committee's recommendation to distribute \$8,500 from the 2023 Endowment Fund Distribution as follows: \$2,500 to Hope For Tomorrow; \$2,500 to Fresh Start; \$2,500 to Simon House and \$1,000 to Yes Arts.

The Worship Committee reported that substitute pastors have been scheduled for each of the Sundays in November and December in light of Reverend Lester's departure at the end of October. Accordingly, a motion was made and unanimously passed to transfer \$2,500 from the Pastor Search/Compensation for New Pastor budget category into the Worship Committee budget category, so that the substitutes can be paid.

A motion was also made and unanimously approved authorizing the Diaconate to use \$100 from the Deacons' Benevolence Fund to pay for a gift card in that amount for Rachel Shaw to help pay for gas and other expenses.

Reverend Lester ended the meeting with prayer.

A lively discussion of Carol Howard's new book on clergy burnout in the age of COVID - "Wounded Pastors" - led by the author drew a large crowd to Okolona Presbyterian Church for a pre-presbytery book study and discussion yesterday.

An even larger crowd gathered for the main event of the day - the presbytery's farewell to its General Presbyter for the last nine years, Rev. John Odom. John was praised for his efforts to strengthen and equip the presbytery's congregations; to provide particularly strong support for such ministries of the presbytery as our four historic African-American churches, Presbyterian seminarians, chaplains and the presbytery's Hispanic/Latino/a ministries; and his creative leadership of the presbytery through the COVID pandemic, including steering funds to congregations to upgrade their technology as they pivoted to online worship.

Rev. Greg Goodwiller, Synod of the Living Waters executive and stated clerk, led the presbytery in a litany of dissolution, which marked the formal conclusion of John's service to Mid-Kentucky Presbytery as he prepares to become the executive for Genesee Valley Presbytery, based in Rochester, New York.

As "parting gifts," John received a framed proclamation from the presbytery, a Louisville Stoneware plate, a stole depicting the children of the world, a proclamation from the mayor of Louisville declaring September 16, 2024 "Rev. John Odom Day," and a gift certificate to a Rochester restaurant.

Parable of the Pufflings


As summer ends on a remote island off Iceland, parent puffins — black and white seabirds with rainbow beaks — stop bringing fish to their chicks. These "pufflings," whose first few weeks were lived in burrows in cliffs, now must launch into a wind current to glide out over the sea and find their own food. Some babies, however, mistake a lit-up house or gas station for moonlight on the water and, as locals say, "fall out of the sky." Because pufflings can't yet take off from land and fly, if left alone they starve.


So for generations, during "puffling season" people on this island have stayed up late to rescue baby birds. On his Animal podcast, reporter Sam Anderson tells how, with an islander's help, he picks up a puffling one night, placing it in a box for morning release over the ocean. As the frightened, confused bird squeals and scratches to get free, Anderson supposes it thinks this is the worst night of its life. In fact, it is the best: It's being saved.

We humans often get confused, pulled in wrong directions. We're misled and land in trouble from which we cannot save ourselves. Scared and confused, we believe we're irredeemably trapped in the worst of circumstances. We can't perceive that, even now, we are being protected and rescued, that God is working to give back to us the fullness of life we cannot attain for ourselves. Hang on, beloved one. Though you can't sense it at this moment, you are held in God's care, soon to be lifted on the wind of the Holy Spirit, who will carry you into better days.
