SFPC Session News

SFPC's first Session meeting in 2025 was held this past cold and snowy Sunday. Due to the bad weather, several of the Elders attended the meeting via Zoom, but all were in attendance, with the exception of one Elder who is recovering from surgery. As indicated below, this was an exciting and important Session meeting for several reasons!

First, while Rev. Steve Pace served as Moderator of the meeting, our new Pastor, Marissa Carver, was also present and she presented her very first Pastor's report at SFPC during the meeting. Second, incoming church officers Tierelee Logan, Ellen Collins, Jennifer Bingham, Toni Lewis and Brooke Christopher attended the meeting, and each provided his/her statement of faith to the Session. It was very moving to hear each person tell why they chose SFPC as their church, and then agreed to serve as either an Elder or a Deacon.



Church Leadership

Several pieces of correspondence were presented to the Session during the meeting, including a very nice note from William "Butch" Brooks thanking a number of people for the Celebration of Life service for his mother, long-time member Ann Shirley Brooks, and requesting that the last Sunday in October each year be "Ann Brooks Hat Day" to remember Ann's joy and love of serving SFPC. Correspondence was also received from the Kings Center describing its activities and history, and requesting that a donation be made to its Annual Giving Campaign.

Committee reports were also provided. Budget and Stewardship presented financial reports showing that SFPC's actual income in 2024 was \$238,027 (including the carryover of \$13,241), and the budgeted income for 2024 was \$248,520. Budgeted expenses were \$248,520, and actual expenses were \$200,785 (Actual expenses were low because we did not have a permanent pastor in 2024.). Accordingly, SFPC ended 2024 well in the black. With respect to the on-going Stewardship Campaign, 51 pledges have been received in the amount of \$171,530. Accordingly, a significant amount of work needs to be done to successfully complete the Stewardship Campaign. Brief reports were provided by several of the other committees.

Marissa Carver's Ordination and Installation service is scheduled for 4:00 pm on February 2, 2025, and all are invited to attend this important service. After that service, Marissa will become "Reverend Marissa Carver!" A motion approving the serving of Communion during that service was unanimously approved. The incoming church officers will be installed during the January 26 worship service, and a motion passed authorizing a Resolution adding Trustees Ann Maenza and Mark Ritter to the Trustees' accounts and removing the former Trustees from the accounts.

The next stated meeting of the Session will be held on February 16. Rev. Pace closed the meeting in prayer.




