#### The Season of Lent

When I think about Lent I think about fasting and Friday fish fries. The area of Western Pennsylvania that I grew up in has a very large Italian-American population, and a very large Irish-American population, so the Catholic Churches were quite prolific and you could find an excellent Friday Fish Fry every mile or so. Most of my friends in school were Catholic, and we would all always discuss what we were going to give up each year for those 40 days. One year I gave up candy, another year I gave up meat altogether. I've given up social media, and snacking after 8 PM. My friends and I would compare how we were faring, and there was often an unspoken competition about whose chosen fasting item was more challenging. And while that's not the intended spirit of fasting during Lent, I do have fond memories of those connections. And, as I got older, I spent more time reflecting on the discomfort that came along with the fast, however mild it may have been.

In recent years, however, I've shifted my ideas around fasting during Lent. Instead of giving something up, I've started trying to take something on instead. A few years ago, I tried to journal every day during the season as journaling was something I used to regularly do as I spent time with God, but I had gotten away from it. Adopting a new practice throughout this season is a wonderful opportunity to explore more deeply how we are waiting and preparing throughout these forty days. It allows us to take on new habits and to unpack areas of our lives where there may be grief or pain

or uncertainty. God meets us in these practices, and Lent is a great season to try and take on a new discipline. Whether you are a give something up every year person or not, I encourage you to find a practice you can take on this year. Maybe you want to take on daily prayer, or reading through a particular book in Scripture. Maybe you want to take on a practice that encourages creativity, or allows you to spend time in solitude. Wherever you are feeling led, I encourage you to try something new this upcoming season of Lent.

# Rend Your Heart An Ash Wednesday blessing by Jan Richardson

To receive this blessing, all you have to do is let your heart break. Let it crack open. Let it fall apart so you can see its secret chambers, the hidden spaces where you have hesitated to go.

Your entire life is here, inscribed whole upon your heart's walls: every path taken or left behind, every face you turned toward or turned away, every word spoken in love or in rage, every line of your life you would prefer to leave in shadow, every story that shimmers with treasures known and those you have yet to find.

It could take you days to wander these rooms. Forty, at least.

And so let this be a season for wandering, for trusting the breaking, for tracing the rupture that will return you to the One who waits, who watches, who works within the rending to make your heart whole.

#### **Earth - Shaking Victory**

On Ash Wednesday in 2001, a 6.8 magnitude earthquake shook the Seattle area. Charlie and Ann Lewis, co-pastors in Snohomish, Washington, reflected on the timing: "While most years we prefer to think of Lent as a contemplative journey of faith as we walk with Jesus toward Jerusalem and the cross, this year we are thinking of how God turned the world upside down at Calvary. From the cross, Jesus cried out with a loud voice, and his life was finished. Then the earth shook violently, the curtain in the temple was torn in two and rocks were split apart. The God who identified with us in our humanity in the incarnation of Jesus Christ demonstrated in that moment the depth of divine love for us — a love that leads God to choose the path of suffering and sacrifice.

"Three days later, the earth shook again — another violent earthquake, and the stone in front of the tomb was rolled away. Then the crucified Christ threw aside the burial cloths, emerging from the darkness of the tomb to walk in the dew of the grass as dawn was breaking across the sky. God had declared victory over sin and death itself. That victory was for us. ... God has given us a glorious life that extends into eternity."


