Adult Mudpies – A Congregational Opportunity

Sometimes in building re-hab we can make adult mud pies. Mixing and working with spackling compound or mortar, sometimes concrete or my favorite, wall plaster, all of which we use in fixing parts of SFPC. We on the Building and Grounds Committee don't want to hog this fun to ourselves so we plan a congregational workday to share the fun on

Saturday, MAY 17, 2025 at 9:30.

You are highly encouraged to wear gloves for all (well most) of the projects. So, the mud pie thing is not as fun as child's play (all adult "mud" has caustic "lime in it so irritates skin.) We are not letting you climb the tallest ladder to caulk the windows on Thomas Place. You will not be soldering copper pipes nor wiring new fixtures as we can't deprive ourselves of all the fun (and those things are dangerous). We'll not let you crawl under the Sanctuary to run sound wires.

B&G's To- do List usually runs to 2 typed pages with the congregation adding to it, which we appreciate as it's difficult to see and remember everything needing attention at the facility. Many are small, quickly done, simple projects. Because B&G focuses on high priority safety or structural issues; often To-do projects are on the list for years. We don't do highly skilled jobs like HVAC repair or fire protection maintenance. B&G manages these and major brick work, roofing repair, major plumbing, or complex electrical projects. We use our experience and research to do repair and upgrades that would cost hundreds of dollars, and also things you don't easily hire help to do.

B&G has listed smaller, simpler projects doable in a day we hope you will volunteer for. They include outdoor work: cleanup, gardening, and painting. Most of the indoor jobs are painting. We have others that involve being a spotter as checking to see if a circuit breaker cuts off lights or receptacle power in a room. We also have a couple jobs we can teach you: to replace ceramic tiles or cut ceiling tile to fit. B&G included research projects to locate material sources that can be done from home with internet search and phone calls (these can even be done on another day). B&G will provide materials and tools, but extra paint tools, brooms, rakes etc. are welcome. We will post the list and sign-up sheets around the church.

We did do a bait and switch, however. You are unlikely to make adult mud pies on Saturday, May 17. The adhesive to hold up the ceramic tiles must dry before grouting. Since we will be helping by providing materials and explaining jobs it's unlikely, we will be able to replace broken bricks and mortar outside.


