This summer, we are exploring God's creativity together. We are exploring how God has acted creatively since the beginning to connect human beings to one another and to God. And we've seen how God creatively and almost absurdly kept God's promise to Abraham to make his descendants a great nation by giving him and Sarah a son at the ripe ages of 100 and 90 respectively.

This Sunday, we will have the opportunity to experience and appreciate one aspect of our human creativity as the SFPC Choir leads us, through music, on a tour through the Bible. Then, beginning on July 12, we will have the chance to try out some new, creative components in worship.

This exploration of God's creativity, and ours, includes an invitation to join in. In what ways are you creative? And how can you use that creativity to connect with God and others, to share the Good News? Writing, singing, playing an instrument, drawing, farming, hiking, cooking - the possibilities are endless. I hope you will take time this summer to reflect on how God can use your creativity to draw you into community and to bring God's kingdom here on earth. Let's keep exploring together!

Inclusive Language Text



The life, death, resurrection, and promised coming of Jesus Christ has set the pattern for the church's mission. His human life involves the church in the common life of all people.

His service to men and women commits the church to work for every form of human well-being. His suffering makes the church sensitive to all human suffering so that it sees the face of Christ in the faces of persons in every kind of need. His crucifixion discloses to the church God's judgment on the inhumanity that marks human relations, and the awful consequences of the church's own complicity in injustice. In the power of the risen Christ and the hope of his coming, the church sees the promise of God's renewal of human life in society and of God's victory over all wrong .
